

PERMIT CONDITIONS
SCHEDULED TRADES AND OCCUPATIONS BYLAWS

NO. ST 4092

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE HEAD: HEALTH

- 1.1 This permit may be suspended or withdrawn if the conditions specified herein are not complied with, or if a nuisance or danger to public health occurs, or if there is any other contravention of these bylaws.
- 1.2 No building, plant or works used in conjunction with the Scheduled Trade/Occupation shall be materially extended, altered or added to and no changes in process or procedures may be undertaken without the prior approval of the Head: Health.
- 1.3 This permit will cease to be of effect on change of ownership or name of the permit holder.
- 1.4 No gases, vapours, dust, smoke, particulates, soot, glare, noise or vibration to be emitted which in the opinion of the Head: Health could cause a nuisance or hazard to health.
- 1.5 The site is to be constructed, operated and managed in accordance with relevant National Provincial and Local legislation and any permits or special consents issued in terms thereof.
- 1.6 The operations on the site are to be conducted in such a manner that
- i) risk to workers and communities are reduced to acceptable levels.
 - ii) pollution of the environment does not exceed acceptable parameters
 - iii) nuisance, danger or health hazards do not arise therefrom.
- 1.7 The Head: Health shall be informed immediately of any change or proposed change in product or process that could have an adverse Health or Environmental consequence (eg. Large increases in product throughput.)
- 1.8 The permit is issued subject to the permit complying with the tariff of charges which will be levied by the permitting authority.

2. SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS OF THE HEAD: HEALTH:

2.1 OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY

2.1.1 Occupational Health and Safety Programme

A full occupational Health and Safety programme must be maintained in consultation with the Health Department, an Approved Inspection Authority and a registered Occupational Medical Practitioner. The Occupational Health and Safety programme must cover all potential stressors and hazards which may arise in or from the work environment.

2.2 TRAINING

2.2.1 All employees exposed to work place hazards/stresses must be adequately and comprehensively informed and trained with regard to:

- the potential sources of exposure;
- the potential risks to health caused by exposure;
- the precautions to be taken by employees to protect themselves against the health risks associated with the exposure;
- the necessity of correct use, maintenance and potential of personal protective equipment and clothing;
- the importance of good housekeeping and personal hygiene;
- the safe working procedures regarding handling, storage and labelling of hazardous chemical substances; and
- procedures to be followed in the event of spillages, leakages or any other similar emergency situation.

2.3 ENVIRONMENTAL NOISE:

All operations, plant and equipment on site must be so run and maintained so that no noise nuisance or disturbance is created in surrounding communities.

2.4 HOUSE KEEPING AND MAINTENANCE PROTOCOL

Documented programmes must be maintained.

3. ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL /PERFORMANCE

3.1 General

- 3.1.1 The warehouse operation must at all times be conducted in such a manner, that no health and safety risks, nuisance or unacceptable environmental impacts occur.
- 3.1.2 Notwithstanding the above, this does not absolve the company from complying with the requirements of any other Governmental Department or National Statute.
- 3.1.3 An Environmental Management Plan (EMP) which incorporates the philosophy of continued improvement must be developed and implemented by the company.

3.2 Air Quality

3.2.1 Equipment, control devices and procedures used during the processing, handling and storage of product which due to its chemical characteristics has the potential to create a nuisance, environmental impact or Health and Safety Risks must be constructed, designed, maintained and used to appropriately high levels of technology such so as to ensure that potential impacts are controlled to within acceptable norms.

4. WATER AND WASTE

- 4.1 All operations must be conducted in such a manner that the risk of soil/ground water/aquatic environments contamination should not occur.
- 4.2 A suitable waste auditing system must be maintained which contains inter-alia the following:
 - iv) a record of all waste generated (including quantities);
 - v) the manner in which such waste is stored prior to disposal;
 - vi) the name and designation of the person charged with the responsibility of ensuring that waste is correctly handled, stored and disposed of;
 - vii) a mechanism whereby waste generated and waste disposed of can be reconciled;
 - viii) adequate documentation to verify the safe disposal of waste removed from the premises.

REPORTING SYSTEMS

5. Re-evaluation

- 5.1 In terms of the OHS Act re-evaluation of stressors is required on a periodic basis for example,
 - Every 2 years for HCS
 - After any change in plant, process, chemical substitutions etc
 - Major changes in throughput
 - After implementation of engineering controls etc

Copies of all such re-evaluations are to be submitted to this department as soon as they become available.
